ABOUT UVIC'S ELECTION PROCESS

9:00am PST on March 1st, 2017 online voting opens for four major elections using UVic's WebVote system. Consider this supplement your guide to the diverse world of elections on campus. Read on for information about the UVSS, BOG, Senate, and GSS elections, plus how and where to vote at polling stations located on campus.

UVSS ELECTIONS

The Elections Office is pleased to provide you with the following elections supplement to provide you with all the information you need to vote in the upcoming University of Victoria Students Society (UVSS) elections, referenda and University Senate and Board of Governors Elections and to provide you with an opportunity to read candidates platforms to help you make an informed decision when you vote. Founded in 1963, the University of Victoria Students' Society (UVSS) strives to represent the interests of all undergraduate students at the University of Victoria. The UVSS provides services, events, and political advocacy to students, and administers and provides resources to clubs and course unions. All UVSS members can vote for up to sixteen candidates (one Director of Outreach and University Relations, one Director of Finance and Operations, one Director of Events, one Director of Student Affairs, one Director of Campaigns and Community Relations, and eleven Directors-at-Large). International Students can vote for one additional candidate for the position of Director of International Student Relations.

Eligibility: All individuals who pay UVSS fees are eligible to vote for elections to the Board of Directors and for Referenda, with the exception of the Director for International Relations, which is only open to international students. Polling period: UVSS Election voting will take place between **March 1st 9 a.m. and March 3rd, 9 a.m.** online at webvote.uvic.ca. There will also be a number of polling stations set up around campus for those without personal electronic devices or who need assistance.

BOARD OF GOVERNOR ELECTIONS

The University of Victoria operates under the authority of the University Act and is governed by a Board of Governors (BOG) and a Senate. The BOG is responsible for the management, administration and control of the property, revenue, business and affairs of the university. The BOG approves the strategic direction and policy of the university as well as the operating budget framework and capital project expenditures. It sets tuition, maintains the university's real property and other assets, and establishes procedures for appointing senior academic administrators, faculty and staff. The BOG is also responsible for appointing the University's president and for providing support and accountability. This

fifteen-member body consists of two students elected from the University's undergraduate or graduate student societies. All UVic students are eligible to vote for up to two candidates.

Eligibility: All UVic credit students.

Polling Period: 9:00am PST on Wed. March 1st to 4:30pm PST on Fri. March 3rd, 2017.

SENATE ELECTIONS

The University of Victoria operates under the authority of the University Act and is governed by a Board of Governors and a Senate. The Senate is responsible for the academic governance of the university, including matters related to libraries, faculties, departments, courses of instruction, fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, prizes, admissions, student appeals, and the granting of degrees (including honorary degrees, diplomas and certificates). Presently, the 72-member Senate consists of 16 elected students (one member from each faculty, except the Faculty of Graduate Studies, which has three representatives, with the remainder elected as at-large student members). All UVic students are eligible to vote for up to 16 candidates.

Eligibility: All UVic credit students.

Polling Period: 9:00am PST on Wed. March 1st to 4:30pm PST on Fri. March 3rd, 2017.

GSS ELECTIONS

The Graduate Students' Society (GSS) is an autonomous, not-for-profit society that works to promote the interests and represent the views of all graduate students at the University of Victoria. The society is democratically organized with members acting through elections, referenda, general meetings and the Graduate Representative Council. The Society operates the George and Ida Halpern Centre for Graduate Students and offers a range of services to graduate students including the Grad House restaurant, extended health and dental plans, free room bookings, and travel grants, among others. All GSS members can vote for up to five candidates (one Chairperson, one Director of Finance, one Director of Communications, one Director of Services, and one Director of Student Affairs).

Eligibility: All students who pay GSS fees: all graduate students.

Polling Period: 9:00am PST on Wed. March 1st to 4:30pm PST on Fri. March 3rd, 2017.

FAQs

In March 2011, UVSS Elections were moved online at the directive of the student body. As such, elections are conducted online using the UVic WebVote System instead of a traditional paper balloting system.

When and where can I vote?

For elections to the UVSS Board of Directors, the polls will open at 9:00am PST on Wed. March 1st, 2017, and close at 9:00am PST on Fri. March 3rd, 2017. The move to online voting increases voting accessibility - you can vote any-time (while polls are open), from wherever you are, and from any internet-accessible device. In addition, for your convenience, there will be nine polling stations located around campus on March 1st & 2nd – *please check the times and locations of the polling stations to ensure that they will be open before you go to vote.*

I have more than one Netlink ID; which do I use?

The system will only allow students to log in and vote using their primary Netlink ID.

When will the results be announced?

The unofficial results of the UVSS Election will be made available online at uvsselections.com by 9 a.m. Monday, March 6th, 2017.

Who can vote?

Since the UVSS election only concerns UVSS members, anyone who has paid UVSS fees for winter semester is eligible to vote (this includes all UVic undergraduate students, all UVic Law students, some Island Medical Program students, and all students who participate in the STEPS Forward program). Co-op, Exchange and Distance students are all able to vote using the same voting system.

How do I vote using WebVote?

To ensure the voting process is clear, here are some brief steps on how to vote and how to spoil your ballot:

1. Go to webvote.uvic.ca
2. Select the election you wish to vote in.
3. Insert Netlink ID and password.
4. To vote successfully, please select the number of candidates specified for that position. For example, for each of the Lead Director and the International Student Representative positions, there is one position available; therefore you can vote for one candidate. For Directors-at-Large there are 11 positions; therefore you can vote for up to 11 candidates. If you select more candidates than permitted for the position, your ballot will be spoiled and your votes will be considered invalid.
5. Once you have made your selections, click 'Vote' below and you've voted!

Are there accessible voting stations?

On March 1st, students in need are encouraged to vote at one of our more easily accessible polling stations, located in the main lobby of Clearihue (9:00am-5:00pm), the McPherson Library (9:00am-9:00pm), and the SUB (11:00am-7:00pm). Please do not hesitate to contact the Elections Office with any concerns or questions about voting accessibility.

ABOUT THE UVSS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

All UVSS members will have the opportunity to select their preferred candidate for each of the following Lead Director positions:

- Director of Outreach and University Relations
- Director of Student Affairs
- Director of Events
- Director of Finance and Operations
- Director of Campaigns and Community Relations

All UVSS members will be able to select up to 11 preferred candidates for the positions of Director at Large.

UVSS International students will be able to select their preferred International Student Relations representative as well.

The University of Victoria Students' Society (UVSS) is made up of the more than 17,000 undergraduate students at the University of Victoria, including the 22 members on the Board of Directors (BOD), who work on their behalf.

The BOD is a body of students elected by students to manage the Society's budget, implement campaigns, advocate on behalf of students, maintain the Society's services, and develop the membership. Students pay a fee each semester to the UVSS – students have chosen, by a majority vote via referendum, to levy themselves a fee for the operation of the UVSS and the services it provides. The UVSS holds two General Meetings each year, at which time all registered undergraduate students have

speaking and voting rights, giving them direct input into the direction of the organization, its policies, and the budget.

The BOD is not a "student government" – the BOD has no legislative power over its electorate. Each member of the BOD has a duty to work with other BOD members to further the interests of the society, and each executive member is responsible and answerable to the student body.

The newly elected BOD begins its term on May 1st. Most of the business of the BOD is conducted through committees, which are struck each year at the beginning of the new BOD term. In addition, each board member is expected to attend a three-day orientation to be scheduled at the end of April/beginning of May.

Of the 22 board members, five are Lead Directors (directors who have constitutionally allocated responsibilities and are paid for 35 hours per week). These include the Director of Outreach & University Relations, the Director of Finance and Operations, the Director of Events, the Director of Student Affairs and the Director of Campaigns and Community Relations. There are also 11 Directors at Large elected by the UVSS membership, the Director of International Student Relations elected by UVic international students, 4 advocacy group reps elected at general meetings of their constituencies, and 1 Native Students Union rep elected by NSU..

All BOD meetings are open to students and the general public, though only members of the BOD may vote; each member has one vote. Board meetings usually occur every other week in the SUB Upper Lounge; all Directors are expected to attend these meetings.

UVSS DIRECTORS - ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Directors work together to shape policy, run campaigns, prepare the budget, resolve administrative decisions, and generally deal with the business of the Society. The offices of the Lead Directors are found in the SUB Students' Society Centre (B103).

Director of Outreach and University Relations

The Director of Outreach and University Relations is the Society's spokesperson. He or she liaises with the University administration, different levels of government, and with student representatives to the Senate and Board of Governors to advance student interests. The Director of Outreach and University Relations regularly chairs Board of Director (BOD) meetings, which must occur at least twice a month.

Director of Finance and Operations

All UVSS financial records, policies, contacts and statements are the responsibility of the Di-

rector of Finance, as is the Society's annual budget. He or she oversees the administration of all UVSS operations and is responsible for the development of financial policy and practice. The Director of Finance and Operations also acts as one of the liaisons between staff (both unionized and non-unionized) and the BOD, through the Personnel Committee.

Director of Events

The Director of Events is responsible for planning and coordinating all events for the UVSS. He or she assists the Director of External Relations with marketing and communication and acts as the UVSS's representative on all matters related to athletics, recreation, and on-campus housing.

Director of Student Affairs

The Director of Student Affairs chairs the Course Union Council and liaises with the Ombudsman's office. He or she also chairs the Course

Union and Club Councils and is charged with facilitating the operations of new and existing clubs.

Director of Campaigns and Community Relations

The Director of Campaigns and Community Relations is in charge of all aspects of UVSS communications and advocacy. He or she coordinates with all levels of government to advocate for student issues and is responsible for keeping the BOD up-to-date on issues and policies that are relevant to members of the UVSS. The Director of Campaigns and Community Relations also serves as the BOD representative on external organizations and committees, such as provincial and national student organizations.

Director of International Student Relations

The Director of International Student Relations is responsible for assisting the Lead Directors

in carrying out their duties and for scrutinizing Lead Director activities. He or she coordinates and implements all levels of campaigns concerning education defense and must participate in at least two committees of the Students' Society. Most importantly he or she must liaise with international students who attend the University of Victoria.

Directors At Large (and Constituency Organization Representatives)

The Directors at large and the Constituency Organization Representatives are responsible for assisting the Lead Directors in carrying out their duties and for scrutinizing Lead Director activities. He or she coordinates and implements all levels of campaigns concerning education defense and must participate in at least two committees of the Students' Society. The Constituency Organization Representatives are also responsible for meeting with their respective constituency organizations.



This year, two referendum questions have been approved by the current Board of Directors and will be included in the UVSS elections ballot:



REFERENDUM QUESTION #1:

“Do you support an increase to the UVSS Food Bank Fund of 75 cents per full-time student and 37 cents per part-time student, per semester, for the purpose of addressing student food insecurity?”

Proponent: Jasmine Robertson

Since our last referendum in 2015, the Food Bank has seen an increase in the number of weekly visits. The current average is 300 visits per week, but our current budget only meets a third of demand. The increasing costs of tuition, housing, and textbooks--as well as rising food prices--are putting more students in positions of food insecurity. Addressing this issue is a crucial way to make post-secondary education more accessible to students.



Over the past 2 years, the Food Bank has built many fruitful community partnerships to bring in more foods free of cost and reduce food waste around the city. However, fresh foods--such as milk, eggs, and produce--are challenging to get for free on a regular basis. The purpose of the Food Bank's food budget is to purchase these much-needed items to round out the canned, bulk, and bread products that are regularly donated.

This referendum would increase the Food Bank's budget by 75%. This significant increase would be felt by hundreds of students every week as they would be able to access a diversity of ingredients for cooking.

At the Food Bank, it is our belief that students need access to nourishing food in order to be well and successful in their studies. Any current UVic student can access the Food Bank on a weekly basis and we also have extra resources available for students supporting families. We strive to create a welcoming, safer space for our volunteers and students, and we appreciate any feedback.



UVSS SEMESTERLY FEES FOR A FULL-TIME STUDENT, 2016-2017



Unlike many other student societies across Canada, UVSS fees currently do not match the rate of inflation. Every year the cost of goods, services, and wages increase, but student fees remain the same. As a result of this annual reduction of purchasing power, groups that collect student fees are unable to consistently provide students with the level of service that they require.

By tying student fees to inflation, we can ensure that all on-campus service providers will have enough funds to continue operating without having to constantly ask students for fee increases. This referendum question help all of our service providers give students better support over the long-term: clubs and course unions, the Martlet, CFUV, the Food Bank, advocacy groups and the NSU, student bursaries, University 101, Campus Community Gardens, the Ombudsperson, and many more!

So on March 1 - 3 VOTE YES to make sure that the UVSS can continue to provide you with great services, awesome events, and advocacy campaigns for many years to come.
