UVSS Food Bank & Free Store Final Report - 2018/2019

MESSAGE FROM THE FOOD BANK & FREE STORE OFFICER

The UVSS Food Bank & Free Store delivered a diverse array of programming, supported primarily by UVic Meal Exchange. By workshops on a range of issues relating to food security and literacy, provide our clients and community members with the skills necessary to support and empower themselves.

This year, the UVSS Food Bank & Free Store supported community grassroots advocacy and outreach campaigns by attending and speaking at conferences and other community events. While we love feeding our community, food banks are a "band aid" solution, and what our community truly needs is systemic change.

Food security advocacy must amplify and represent the voices and needs of students from marginalized backgrounds - especially lower-income students. For example, marginalized communities and members need to be represented at any stakeholder events aimed at finding solutions to large-scale issues such as the housing crisis, regional food insecurity, post-secondary education affordability, and the additional difficulties faced by Indigenous peoples, people of colour, LGBTQIA+ people, people living with disabilities, and lower-income people in accessing post-secondary resources in the first place. This critical lens informed staff outreach and participation on relevant panels.

WORKSHOPS AND EVENTS

- A clothing swap! Hosted in the autumn of 2018, we encouraged community members to "swap till you drop!" With hundreds of items at the clothing swap, both donated directly for the event and provided from the Free Store supply, we worked to ensure that community members were able to reuse old clothes as well as find new ones.
- Repair Cafe(s)! The UVSS Food Bank and Free Store supported the student-led initiative, the
 UVic Repair Cafe, in hosting one event during both the fall and spring semesters. These Repair
 Cafes are based off of an international model of reducing waste, building community, and
 repurposing items. During each event, a team of dedicated volunteers provided their time and
 energy to fix items ranging from appliances to household goods to clothing, ensuring that items
 in need of a little extra work were able to be repurposed instead of thrown out.
- Cooking: Community Based. In October, we partnered with UVic Meal Exchange, the Campus Community Garden, and Topsoil to provide a workshop centred on ways of cooking with

- locally-sourced products. The workshop was well-attended, and facilitated great conversations about the importance of shopping locally.
- A Taste of Fair Trade was another Meal Exchange and Food Bank collaboration, this time
 focusing on fair-trade goods in a Canadian context. During this workshop, we prepared a
 banana-based dessert of entirely fair-trade ingredients, and hosted a community roundtable
 about the intersection between food justice, globalization, and workers' rights.
- Maseca: A Cultural Foods Project was another autumnal event, focused on exploring the ways
 in which food can serve as a crucial element of culture and community. With a growing user
 base of international students, the UVSS Food Bank expanded our offerings to include a more
 diverse array of foods, ensuring that students can still find a little taste of home. The maseca
 workshop centered around the cultural heritage of Latin American foods, and was supported in
 part by the Students of Colour Collective.
- Cooking on a Budget! This workshop, though initially rescheduled due to a surprise winter snow day, still managed to create an engaging community discussion on the difficulties of eating healthy food on a limited budget, as well as providing advice for ways to eat healthy and affordably! With help from the SUB-based RBC pop-up, students were able to explore their own financial literacy in the context of food. RBC also helped to explore broader issues of budgeting while in post-secondary, and provided a range of different learning materials to support student engagement.
- In February, we hosted our Accessible Cooking Workshop in collaboration with UVic Meal Exchange and the Society for Students with a Disability (SSD). Students were provided with high-energy snacks and supplies, such as protein-enriched oatmeal and breakfast shakes, before embarking on a community roundtable on the challenges of eating healthy while living with issues such as chronic fatigue or limited mobility. Students shared tips and tricks for cooking and purchasing food, and organizers provided participants with a multi-page booklet with recipes and meal ideas!
- On March 8th, 2019, we hosted our biggest event to date: a Cultural Foods Celebration! With a
 grant provided by EQHR UVic, and volunteer time kindly donated by both UVic Global
 Communities and UVic Meal Exchange, this event enabled hundreds of students to sample
 foods including traditional Pakistani cuisine, Indian curries, Syrian food, Mexican food,
 Indigenous cuisine, and a range of others! This event was both well-attended and
 well-supported, and we hope that it is the first of many celebrations of UVic's culinary diversity.
- To finish the year, we worked alongside SSD to provide three free community lunches during exam season - when you're tired and studying all day, you probably don't have time to cook yourself a full meal! These lunches included Syrian and Indian cuisine from local restaurants, and we managed to feed over 50 students at each event.

OUTREACH AND PANELS

- The Capital Region Food and Agriculture Initiatives Roundtable (CRFAIR) Good Food Summit.
 At this event, the UVSS Food Bank, Community Cabbage, the Campus Community Garden, and UVic Meal Exchange formed a panel to discuss issues such as sustainability and affordability within the food movement.
- Resetting the Table: Food Secure Canada's AGM. This event featured idea-sharing with other food banks across Canada.

- Meal Exchange's Student Food Conference: This conference focused on skill-building, such as fundraising and social media promotion, and enabled the UVSS Food Bank and UVic Meal Exchange to raise awareness of both UVic and BC-centric food issues.
- Connecting the Dots: Intersectionality on Health. This event, hosted by the Grad Students Society and the UVic Social Dimensions of Health department, featured discussions about the ways in which food security serves as a fundamental human right, as well as the connection between access to food and both personal and community health.
- The National Farm to School Conference. The UVSS Food Bank and other regional stakeholders discussed advocating for greater food literacy support and programming in schools.
